#### Islington Register of Locally Listed Buildings and Locally Significant Shopfronts.

- Publicly available version dated April 2010
- 1650+ entries. Many more individual properties. From 1970s to early 2000s
- Industrial buildings; public buildings; police stations; fire stations; religious buildings; charitable buildings; schools; tube stations; tram sheds; railway buildings; terraces; mansion flats; pubs for their overall architecture; prison buildings; villas; but short of post Edwardian 20<sup>th</sup> century buildings
- From 1993 shopfronts and pub frontages
- No statutory protection. Advisory only
- Greater protection in Conservation Areas
- Vulnerable elsewhere



## Islington Local List Revision Project

- Begun 2016
- Islington project run by The Building Exploratory, previous project in Hackney
- Partly funded by Historic England
- Filling a national need for creation and revision of local lists
- Volunteer execution, within strict guidelines
- Perhaps 50% complete when Building Exploratory shut down by trustees
- Completed by Islington Society
- Presented to Council conservation officers March 2021






